As I understand it all(or nearly all) of the water systems servicing our homes are equipped with the RPZ valves. Where we need your assistance is on those water hook ups you have that might be separate from your home water system. Examples would be outside water hook ups or water service to garages or other outbuildings. We would ask that you determine that your system is properly protected. This protects the entire water system from contamination. In the hear future we will likely be coming around requiring documentation or proof that they are properly equipped. We appreciate your cooperation on this effort
